In doing so, we would like to share some words from our friends and supporters at the [JCC Association](#) which have for us, inspired reflection and learning. Commemorating Juneteenth “is a long overdue step and more important than ever this year...It marks the day in 1865 that all slaves learned they were free, as news of Lincoln’s 1863 Emancipation Proclamation and the 13th Amendment did not reach slaves in Texas until over two years later. Juneteenth is not widely known by white Americans and is not recognized as a federal holiday. Most students never learn about it. We hope to raise awareness of this important day and push back against the systemic white-washing of U.S. history...If you’re not familiar with the
